About Us

Shiawassee County Community Mental Health Authority is a public mental health agency with a dedicated team of experienced mental health professionals who provide compassionate care, supported by evidence based practices, to community residents. We provide mental health services to adults with serious mental illness, substance use disorder, co-occurring (mental health and substance use) disorder, children with serious emotional disturbances and persons with developmental disabilities. County residents who have Medicaid, ABW, MI-Child or are uninsured or underinsured are eligible to receive services as determined during the intake process and clinical assessment. We believe recovery is possible, valuable, and achievable for everyone.

How To Access Help

Our staff welcomes you and will provide a wide array of specialty supports and services. Additional services may need to be provided within the community depending on the level of care needed.

The first step is to call our office at 989.723.6791. Before services can be started, you will take part in an assessment to determine eligibility and to identify services that can best meet your needs.



Person Centered Planning

Person Centered Planning empowers people to be the drivers of their own health and wellness goals. This begins during the initial assessment and is later used to design your plan for mental health services and treatment. During this planning phase, you are welcome to invite anyone you wish that may provide support in the process. This may include family, friends, and people in your community who can help. Person Center Planning is your right protected by the Michigan Mental Health Code.

Emergency Services



If you think you may need help with excessive anger, fear, sadness, anxiety, depression or other mental health symptoms, please call us. Staff are available to talk with you ... day or night.

Walk-in business hours are Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. During this time, people are welcome to come in without an appointment, or contact us by calling 989.723.6791 or 1.800.622.4514.

Clinicians are available by telephone 24 hours a day/7 days a week. If you or someone you know is in danger of harming them self or others, dial 911 immediately.
